(Fishers, Indiana) – Fishers Police Arrest 3 Men Overnight Accused of Stealing From Neighborhood Vehicles

At approximately 2:44 A.M. January 15, 2010, Fishers Police Units were dispatched to the 7500 block of St. George Boulevard regarding a call of suspicious activity. A resident, while letting his dog out, reported seeing three males walking down the street looking into parked vehicles.

The first Fishers Officer to enter the neighborhood soon noticed three males matching the reported description as he approached the intersection of Ashley Place and Garrick Street located in the Burberry Place neighborhood. Upon seeing the officer's fully marked squad car, the three men ran and jumped a fence between houses and continued fleeing to the north.

A perimeter was set up and a K-9 Unit was contacted to assist. During the search, an officer confirmed that a vehicle parked along Ashley Place had items stolen from it. Ultimately, all three men were found and taken into custody. Two of the men, identified as Jordan Bennett (18/Indianapolis) and Jonathan Love (20/Indianapolis), were found near the intersection of 116th Street and Hague Road. The other male, identified as Rodson Guelce (19/Indianapolis) was located near the 8000 block of 106th Street by an assisting Carmel Police Officer.

The vehicle the men had arrived in was located in Burberry Place along St. George Boulevard. Several miscellaneous items including electronic devices such as GPS units, a lap top computer, and digital cameras were discovered in the vehicle during the course of the investigation. Some of the items were confirmed stolen while the ownership of other items is still being investigated.

All three men were charged with theft and transported to the Hamilton County Jail.

The Fishers Police Department takes this opportunity to commend all involved on a job well done and a special thanks to Carmel Police for assisting with the apprehension of the third suspect. We would also like to especially commend the resident who not only was very observant, but more importantly acted on his suspicions by calling to report what he saw.

As always, the Fishers Police Department encourages all of our residents to always lock their vehicles and remove all items of value before leaving vehicles unattended.
