(Fishers, Indiana) – Fishers Police respond to overnight residential entry call resulting in arrest of man believed to be responsible for numerous ‘peeping’ and residential entry cases that have plagued the area.

At approximately 1:00 a.m. on August 4, 2009 a homeowner living in 11800 block of Wedgeport Lane (Meadowbrook Village subdivision) awoke to the sound of her dog barking in her bedroom. She then observed a dark silhouette of a person standing in her bedroom doorway. Her dog immediately chased the prowler out of the room, down the stairs, and out of the home through the garage. The homeowner immediately called Dispatch and several Fishers Officers responded to the area. Officers and K-9 searched the area extensively but were unable to locate the suspect.

Then at approximately 5:00 a.m. a couple living in the 12000 block of Biddle Drive (Oak Hall subdivision) were awakened by the sound of a crash downstairs in their home. They initially thought the sound came from their cat knocking something over. Approximately 5 minutes later however they heard the distinct sound of someone coughing downstairs and upon investigation, they found several doors standing open in the house including an upstairs bedroom door that they said remains shut at all times. They did not see anyone and assumed whoever had been in their home had exited either through an open garage or sliding glass door.

At approximately 5:38 a.m. Fishers Police were dispatched along with a Carmel Police K-9 unit to assist. Fishers Police Detective Luke Gannon (the lead detective that has been working on several prowler cases in this area) happened to be awake and heard this radio traffic. Detective Gannon has for some time suspected an area adult resident named Carlos G. Perez to be responsible for the numerous prowler cases so he immediately drove to Perez’s house located on the 12800 block of Raiders Blvd (Bristols subdivision) with the hope that the K-9 and area officers would force Perez to return to his home.

At approximately 6:15 a.m. Detective Gannon reported seeing Carlos Perez enter his back yard and walk toward the rear door of his house. Gannon approached Perez, identified himself, and ordered Perez to stop near the rear door. Perez said he wasn’t going to speak to Gannon and continued forward into the house by pushing past Gannon. Shortly thereafter other units arrived and Perez was ultimately taken into custody without further incident. A short time later, the K-9 ended his track at Perez’s

back door after having started from the Biddle Drive residence located in a neighboring subdivision.

Working closely with the Prosecutor's Office, Detective Gannon charged Perez with one count of Residential Entry and one count of Resisting Law Enforcement. The investigation continues with the likelihood of additional charges to follow.
