(Fishers, Indiana) - The Fishers Police Department arrested Carlos Gabriel Perez on Thursday, October 2nd and charged him with two counts of burglary, one count of attempted burglary and one count of theft. The charges are the culmination of an investigation that began on September 25, 2008.

On September 25, 2008 at 12:41 am officers were dispatched to 12051 Driftstone Drive in Fishers. The homeowner reported that an unknown male attempted to enter her home through a back door. She told officers that her dogs began to bark. As she walked to the back door she noticed the door closed completely. She told officers that she left the door open with a locked storm door. She locked the door and looked out a window. She described seeing the shadow of a person moving south from her backyard.

At 3:13 am deputies from the Hamilton County Sheriff's Department were dispatched to 12610 Walrond Road (near 126th and Brooks School Road) The homeowner reported that she woke up to something and went to investigate. When she exited her bedroom she heard a noise in the next bedroom. She noticed that someone was closing the bedroom door. She opened the door and observed the back door that leads outside standing open and pieces of mulch on the carpet.

At 6:53 am officers were dispatched to the area of 12099 Bears Way in Fishers. The homeowner reported a prowler in his fenced backyard. The suspect was able to provide a description of the suspect. Officer Dan Osborn located the suspect walking in the 12800 block of Raiders Boulevard.

Officers later learned of a theft from a vehicle that occurred at 12605 Walrond Road. The owner reported that cash was taken from the car. Carlos Perez had the same amount of cash in his pocket when he was located by police.

A warrant was issued on October 1, 2008 for Carlos Perez. He was arrested on October 2, 2008 and transported to the Hamilton County Jail.

Investigators from the Fishers Police Department continue to investigate two home invasions in the Windermere sub-division that occurred in 2005 and 2006. They are also investigating a home invasion that occurred in the Brooks Chase sub-division in May of 2008. Carlos Perez lived in Windermere for a period of time before moving to The Bristols sub-division near Brooks Chase. Carlos Perez is now a person of interest in those home invasions as well. The investigation is ongoing.

(Fishers, Indiana) - The Fishers Police Department is investigating a home invasion that occurred at approximately 5:00 am on Wednesday, May 7, 2008. Officers responded to Courage Crossing in the Brooks Chase sub-division (131st and Brooks School Road) after the homeowner reported finding a man in the master bedroom. Officers responded to the area but did not locate the man.

The homeowner reported that she was the first to wake up and see a man crawling on the floor of their bedroom. She immediately woke her husband who attempted to grab the man but he was unable to hold him. The suspect ran out the front door of the residence. The homeowner chased the man west towards Brooks School Road but was not able to catch him. The only description of the suspect is that he is a short, skinny male.

(Fishers, Indiana) – The Fishers Police Department is investigating an attempted residential entry that occurred on 10200 block of Glenn Abbey Lane in Windermere. The resident told police that his alarm sounded at 4:00 am on August 7th. The alarm drop came from the garage entry door. The homeowner checked his house and locked the garage entry door, but did not look in the garage.

He later discovered that his overhead garage door was open and it appeared that someone looked through his cars parked in the garage. The homeowner believes that the suspect(s) entered through the open overhead door. When the suspect(s) opened the door to the residence the alarm sounded and scared them off. Nothing was taken from the cars or residence.

A police canine unit did track north and west from the residence toward the area of 106th Street and Mollenkopf Road. If anyone has information, please call the police department.

(Fishers, Indiana) – The Fishers Police Department is investigating a report of residential entry and two prowler reports that may be related. The reports were made in the Windermere sub-division near 96th and Mollenkopf Road last night and early this morning.

On Tuesday, April 11 at approximately 10:45 pm a homeowner in the 10300 block of Lakeland Drive reported a prowler looking in a window of a neighbor's home. The homeowner described the person as a male wearing a hooded sweatshirt and possibly baggy pants. He estimated that the man was 5'6" to 5'8" tall and thin to medium build. The homeowner yelled at the man and he ran away.

On Wednesday, April 12 at approximately 1:00 am police officers responded to the 10500 block of Greenway Drive. The homeowners reported waking to find an unknown male in their bedroom. The husband and wife were in bed when the woman woke to find a man standing in the room. The man ran from the residence. The husband, wife and three children were not injured and nothing was taken from the residence.

The bedroom was dark but the homeowner described the person as possibly 6' tall, large/thick build, wearing long shorts and a hooded sweatshirt. Police officers set a perimeter and searched the area with a police k-9 unit but did not locate the suspect. Upon arrival the police department found the garage door open and the access door to the residence unlocked. The homeowners could not recall if they closed the door earlier in the evening.

On Wednesday, April 12 at approximately 1:20 am a homeowner in the 10500 block of Greenway Drive reported to police that her outside water valve was turned on. Police arrived quickly but did not locate anyone. The homeowner did not see the suspect.

Crime Watch Information

May 31, 2005

On Friday, May 27th at approximately 11:45pm police officers were dispatched to 10300 Block of Lakeland Drive in the Windermere sub-division. A homeowner called 911 to report an unknown man inside her home.

Several officers responded to the area. When they arrived at the home, they found the back sliding door standing open. They checked the interior of the residence and did not locate the man inside. Officers set a perimeter in the area and police K-9 units responded to the scene. Police were in the area for several hours. The suspect was not located.

Police officers have saturated the area during the night and early morning hours. Uniformed officers have been patrolling the area on foot. Officers have been walking between and behind homes in the area looking for suspicious activity, prowlers, etc.

On May 29th a homeowner on Lakeland Drive discovered a screen that had been cut on their sunroom. No one entered the home and nothing was taken.
